Rabbi Daniel Rapp

June 29 – July 21



Rabbi Daniel Rapp is associate dean of Judaic studies and a visiting assistant professor of Talmud for the Irving I. Stone Beit Midrash Program. Rabbi Rapp received his BA, cum laude, from Yeshiva College in 1990. In 1995, he received his juris doctor from Columbia University School of Law, where he was twice named a Harlen Fisk Stone scholar for academic excellence and was articles editor of the Columbia Business Law Review.

He spent two and a half years studying at Yeshivat Kerem B'Yavneh in Israel and was ordained at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary, receiving Yadin Yadin semichah. Rabbi Rapp is a dayan (judge) at the Beth Din of America. He has lectured on a wide range of topics, with a focus on the interface between halachah and the modern world.

Rabbi Etan Schnall is a member of the prestigious Bella & Harry Wexner Kollel Elyon at RIETS, a competitive post-graduate fellowship for advanced rabbinic training at Yeshiva University. He graduated Yeshiva College Suma Cum Laude as a Golding Distinguished Scholar with a BA in economics in 2005, and was also selected as valedictorian of the Mazer

Yeshiva Program. He was ordained at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary, where he also completed the Wexner Semicha Honors program.

Rabbi Schnall serves as Assistant Campus Shabbos Rabbi at Yeshiva University, and spends his summers teaching children with debilitating illnesses at Chai Lifeline's Camp Simcha Special. He also prepares dozens of engaged men annually for marriage through instruction in the laws of Taharas HaMishpacha. Rabbi Schnall has traveled as a scholar-in-residence to cities throughout North America, lecturing on topics of Jewish Law and Philosophy.

CJF Summer Programs 2011



New Orleans/Birmingham Service Mission

Students will rebuild, revive and reenergize the communities of New Orleans, destroyed by Hurricane Katrina in 2005, and Birmingham destroyed by the recent tornadoes. Students will be engaging in service work and interacting with Jewish and non-Jewish community members affected by the disasters. With support from Repair the World

Counterpoint Israel: Dimona

Students will spend five weeks enlivening the summer for hundreds of Israeli teens living in the development town of Dimona, giving teens the opportunity to learn Jewish values, develop their English skills and participate in workshops such as art, fashion and break-dance. With support from the Zusman Family, Sharon & Avraham Blumenthal and Repair the World

Counterpoint Israel: Arad

Students will attend a Social Action course in New York and then travel to the development town of Arad in Southern Israel to run a summer camp for local teens, where they will practically apply what they have learned. With support from Congregation Beth El-Atereth Israel of Newton, MA, the Jewish Federation of Central New Jersey and Delaware and Repair the World

Counterpoint Israel: Yemin Orde

Students will spend three weeks providing emotional support and a positive summer experience to the teens of Yemin Orde Youth Village which was burned down by the Carmel Fires earlier this year. With support from the Jewish Federations of North America

Counterpoint Brazil

A team of experienced educators will travel to Colegio Iavne, a high school in Sao Paulo Brazil, to run cutting edge programming focused on Jewish identity, tradition and teen issues and learn from local community leaders about the Brazilian Jewish community of today - and tomorrow.

Kansas City Summer Experience

Eight men and women will become a part of the Kansas City BIAV Jewish community for a month, spending their days working at a variety of exciting internships, and dedicating their nights to energizing and learning Torah with the Jewish community

Chicago Lay Leadership Summer Program

Students will spend their summer immersed in Torah and Avodah, spending half their days learning with the Yeshiva University Torah Mitzion Kollel of Chicago and working the other half of their day at meaningful internships in their chosen fields

Keter Torah Teaneck Summer Kollel

Twelve men will inspire the Teaneck, NJ community by engaging in rigorous Torah study under the guidance of Rabbi Eli Baruch Shulman and Rav Shalom Baum, teaching Torah and interacting with youth, and coordinating an evening Beit Midrash for students returning from their year of study in Israel.

Rinat Yisrael Women's Beit Midrash

This 4 week program for women, combining dynamic Torah study with community outreach, will be hosted by Congregation Rinat Yisrael in Teaneck, NJ. Ten full time learning Fellows will learn in text-intensive sessions and lectures focusing on Halakha, Gemara and Tanach during the day, while offering afternoon programs for elementary school students and evening lectures for the broader community.

Atlanta Beit Midrash

Eight men and women will engage and inspire the greater Atlanta Jewish community while engaging in serious Torah study under the guidance of Rabbis Jeremy Wieder, Michael Brody and Adam Starr.

Beth Jacob Summer Learning Program

Ten men and women will become a part of and inspire the Beth Jacob and larger Los Angeles Jewish communities by learning Torah with the community under the guidance of Rabbi Dr. Alex Mondrow, Rabbi Kalman Topp and Rabbi Uri Pilichowski.

Stamford Community Kollel

Four men will invigorate and experience the warmth of the Young Israel of Stamford and greater Stamford Jewish community by learning with and running programs under the guidance of Rabbis Daniel Z. Feldman and Elly Krinsky.
