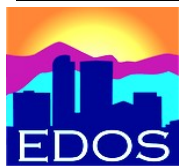

Events & Notes

Pesach Times—This year, with Pesach beginning Motzoei Shabbat, on April 12th, has complicated times. Bedikah is Thursday night, April 10th; chametz burning by Friday morning, 11:55 AM; Shabbat motzi (Friday night, and Shabbat lunch and Seudah Shlishit) requires some chametz, but one should be careful to avoid any crumbs from it in the house. Shacharit on Shabbat is early (7 AM) to allow a chametz seudah, early. The latest time to eat chametz is Shabbat morning, April 12th, at 10:49 AM, with annulment (bitul) by 11:55 AM. Rabbi Engel gives the Shabbat Hagadol drasha at 6 PM. Candle lighting time next Shabbat will be 7:16 PM, first day of Yom Tov: 8:17 PM, and 2nd day of Yom Tov, 8:18 PM.
